### John Beaumont was patriot, member of G.A.R.

John Beaumont was born in 1843 in a log cabin on the family farm on White Lake, and he spent most of his life on that Highland farm except for a year in Hartland, another in West Highland, and the two years he spent in the service of his country during

the Civit War

His father, Francis Beaumont,
was the owner of a land grant signed by President Polk. The estate was registered with Centennial Farms

registered with Centennial Farms by John's son, Harry, in the Oakland County Museum in Pontiae.

John enlisted in the 3rd Michigan Chvalry on January 6, 1864, and he served with the Union army under Philip Sheridan until be was mustered out on February 12, 1866, v) Sus Andree. at San Antonio

One of his assignments was being sent with his company in pursuit of the fleeing Confederate president, Jefferson Davis. He was always a loyal member of

the G.A.R. He was a member of the Heber Le Favour post in Milford which once had 189 members. He had seen his comrades slip away. one by one, until the post had only two members left, and he. 96, and George Sturdevant, 98, were the only ones to represent their post in 1940.

The churches in Highland alter-nated in having the Memorial Day service. The G.A.R. members used to march in a body to pews reserved as a place of honor for them. John Beaumont rarely missed a

Memorial Day or other patriotic oc-casion. However during the last decade of his life he was usually the only one there

I can remember one such occasion at the Methodist Church in the 1939s when his son, Harry, brought him in uniform, decorated with his military insignia and ribbons, and he marched with military bearing to a front

He attended state and national G.A.R. conventions. In 1938 he was in Gettysburg for the reunion of both union and conferenate soldiers. At his death he was senior vice com-mander of Michigan G.A.R.

He was a patriot, and he often spoke in behalf of his country and

the "eld flag," which he loved. He voted for the first time when he was in service and he cast his first ballot for Abraham Lincoln.

A churchman, he joined the White

Lake Presbyterian Church in 1890 and was made an elder in 1917, serv ing in that capacity for over 20

He and his wife enjoyed their



January 6, 1864, and he served with the Union army under Philip Sheridan

"golden years" together. He mar-ried Harrist Duckering in 1873, and they had 62 years of wedded life. She died in 1835; and five years

later, still in excellent health, he lost

his looting stepping down from a curb causing a fractured hip. He contracted pneumonia, and he answered the last Roll Call on April
